GTCC's potential QEP success goals and expected outcomes.

- 1. Improve student attendance and engagement.
 - a. Increase student engagement in the first three weeks of class (SENSE survey)
 - i. Decrease the percentage of students reporting that they have turned in an assignment late
 - ii. Decrease the percentage of students reporting that they have not turned in an assignment* (statistically significant from peers)
 - iii. Decrease the percentage of students reporting that they have come to class without completing readings or assignments
 - iv. Decrease the percentage of students reporting that they have skipped Class
 - a. Increase the percentage of students attending at the 25%, 50%, 60%, 70%, 80% point in the semester.
 - b. Decrease the number and percent of early alerts that are attendance-related.
 - c. Increase the percentage of students reporting being engaged in class using the SENSE Engaged Learning Construct
 - d. Increase the percentage of faculty structuring classes to promote attendance (need a survey of some type)
- 2. Improve gateway course success rates.
 - a. Increase course success in high enrollment transfer gateway courses

- b. Increase course success in high enrollment CTE gateway course
- 3. Improve student persistence
 - a. Increase the percentage of First Time at GTCC students retained from Fall to Spring.
 - b. Increase the percentage of First Time at GTCC students retained Fall to Fall
 - c. Increase the percentage of First Time at GTCC students achieving twelve credits within two years.
- 4. Reduce achievement gaps in course success and persistence.
 - a. Decrease the equity gap in course success for First Time at GTCC Students
 - b. Decrease the equity gap in the percentage of students retained Fall to Fall
- 5. Decrease financial burden on students
 - a. Decrease students who do not have satisfactory academic progress (SAP) requirements for continued financial aid.
 - b. Decrease the default rate for students
