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## About the NCP RIBN Collaborative

The NCP RIBN program is a collaborative between GTCC and NC A&T State University. It is a four-year program, where students graduate with two nursing degrees — an Associate in Applied Science degree (AAS) and Bachelor of Science degree (BSN).

GTCC is the home school for the first three years of the program. Students will be enrolled in both GTCC and NC A&T for the first three years of the program taking the majority of the coursework at GTCC. Classes with NC A&T are online for the first three years. Students can work as a nurse after completing the Associate in Applied Science degree and passing the NCLEX-RN (national licensure examination). Year four of the program is completed entirely online through NC A&T State University.

## How much does the RIBN program cost?

Students in the RIBN program pay GTCC tuition and fee rates for courses taken at GTCC. The current tuition and fee rates for GTCC's portion of the RIBN program is approximately \$6,400 plus books and other supplies.

Since the courses taken at NC A&T are online, students pay the tuition and fee rates for distance education courses. The current tuition and fee rates estimate for the RIBN program is \$7,100 plus books and other supplies.

**The 4-year RIBN program's total cost for tuition and fees is subject to change, but at the time this document was printed, it is estimated at roughly \$13,500 for both GTCC and NC A&T's tuition and fees. The costs for textbooks and other supplies is additional.**

Students are encouraged to complete the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and **note only GTCC** on the application for years one through three.

- It's an affordable option to a full four-year university nursing program.
- It's a seamless associate to baccalaureate degree education program!
- Your first three years will be completed at GTCC. All BSN courses at NC A&T are completed ONLINE.
- After your third year, you are able to work as a Registered Nurse after passing the NCLEX-RN examination.

## **If you have met all of the requirements, then you are eligible to apply to the Fall 2025 NCP RIBN program. Let’s get started!**

### **Step 1: Complete the GTCC Admission Process by Friday, March 14, 2025, by 5:00PM.**

Complete the NC Residence process and obtain your **Residency Certification Number (RCN)**. *Don’t lose this number* – you’ll need it to complete both your GTCC and eventually your NC A&T applications for admission! Submit your **GTCC Application for Admission**, found at the website listed above and submit official transcripts.

#### **Transcripts for High School Seniors (class of 2025):**

- ✓ Even though you haven’t graduated yet, please have your counselor submit a **preliminary** copy of your **official high school transcript** to the GTCC Admissions Office by email at [transcripts@gtcc.edu](mailto:transcripts@gtcc.edu) that includes your current senior year grades. You will be required to provide a final transcript after you graduate.

#### **Transcripts for High School/GED Graduates:**

- ✓ Please submit official transcripts from high school and **ALL** colleges attended (if applicable) to the GTCC Admissions Office by email at [transcripts@gtcc.edu](mailto:transcripts@gtcc.edu) (*Note: it is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all official transcripts have been received by GTCC’s Admissions Department. Please visit <https://transcripts.gtcc.edu/> to verify that your transcripts have been received*).
- ✓ **If you have completed a Bachelor’s degree, the high school transcript requirement is waived.**

Once your transcripts have been received by the GTCC Admissions Office, it may take as many as 7-10 business days before they are recorded and entered into your GTCC Admissions file.

### **Step 2: Submit the Fall 2025 NCP RIBN Interest Application and Required Documents electronically to the Limited Entry Programs Office by Friday, March 28, 2025, at 5:00pm.**

#### High School Seniors:

- ✓ Upload a copy of your SAT or ACT score report – it can be an unofficial copy for this purpose. Applicants **with a cumulative unweighted GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale are exempt from this requirement.**
- ✓ Upload a copy of your high school transcript – high school seniors should have current grades posted. (You will have already submitted your transcript to the Admissions Office, but we need a copy as well).
- ✓ Nurse Aide Certification – upload a copy of your current NC Nurse Aide Registry listing. High school seniors who do not yet have certification must list their expected date of completion. Your NA I Certification must be kept CURRENT throughout the Associate Degree Nursing program.

#### High School/GED Graduates with [less than 24 credit hours](#) of college coursework:

- ✓ Upload a copy of your SAT or ACT score report – it can be an unofficial copy for this purpose. **Applicants with a cumulative GPA of 3.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale from all schools attended and applicants who are age 21 or older are exempt from this requirement.**
- ✓ Please make sure to submit official high school and **all college transcripts** to GTCC Admissions **by email at transcripts@gtcc.edu**. Once received, transcripts are evaluated by GTCC's Admissions staff. Approved transfer credits will be added to your academic record as appropriate. (*Note: it is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all official transcripts have been received by GTCC's Admissions Department. Please visit <https://transcripts.gtcc.edu/> to verify that your transcripts have been received*).
- ✓ Nurse Aide Certification – upload a copy of your current NC Nurse Aide Registry listing. Applicants who do not yet have certification must list their expected date of completion. Your NA I Certification must be kept CURRENT throughout the Associate Degree Nursing program.

#### Applicants age 21 or older with [24 or more credit hours](#) of college coursework:

- ✓ Please make sure to submit official high school and **all college transcripts** to GTCC Admissions **by email at transcripts@gtcc.edu**. Once received, transcripts are evaluated by GTCC's Admissions staff. Approved transfer credits will be added to your academic record as appropriate. (*Note: it is the responsibility of the applicant to ensure that all official transcripts have been received by GTCC's Admissions Department. Please visit <https://transcripts.gtcc.edu/> to verify that your transcripts have been received*).
- ✓ Remember – the SAT/ACT and UNC Minimum Course Requirements are waived for you.
- ✓ Nurse Aide Certification – upload a copy of your current NC Nurse Aide Registry listing with your interest application. Your NA I Certification must be kept CURRENT throughout the Associate Degree Nursing program.

### **Step 3: Once You Have Been Cleared by the Limited Entry Programs Office, Schedule and Take the ATI TEAS (Test of Essential Academic Skills) by March 21, 2025.**

Once your *Fall 2025 RIBN Nursing Interest Application* has been received by the Limited Entry Programs Office, they will review your application to make sure you meet the minimum eligibility requirements for the program. **They will contact you via your GTCC email and provide information on how to schedule and take the ATI TEAS at GTCC's Assessment Center (or alternate location) by March 21, 2025.**

The ATI TEAS is a computer-based test that contains 4 sections (reading, writing, mathematics, and science). The test takes approximately 3.5 hours to complete. **RIBN applicants must achieve a minimum composite score of 68 on the ATI TEAS to be able to progress to Step 4 of the admission process.**

**Step 4: Once You Have Achieved the Minimum Composite Score, Submit a Copy of your ATI TEAS Score to the Limited Entry Programs Office by March 21, 2025.**

Once you have achieved the required minimum score of **68**, you will notify the Limited Entry Programs Office for instructions on how to submit a copy of your exam score.

**Step 5: Ranking of Eligible Applicants.**

After March 21, applicants who achieved a minimum composite score of **68** on the ATI TEAS will be “ranked” using the following points system. The top ten ranking applicants will be offered a space in the fall 2025 RIBN Nursing class.

**Step 6: By April 18, 2025, conditional admission letters from GTCC’s Nursing Program will be sent to the top ten ranking applicants. To be fully-admitted to the RIBN program, the applicant must apply and be admitted to both GTCC and NC A&T.**

In the Conditional Admission Letter from GTCC, the applicant will be given instructions on how to complete NC A&T’s application for admission. Applicants typically receive their letter of admission from NC A&T’s Nursing program by mid-June. **Do not contact NC A&T directly until you receive a conditional admission letter from GTCC.**

Those who are not selected to the program will also receive notification letters by April 18<sup>th</sup> as well.

**Step 7: Fully-Admitted RIBN Students must attend a mandatory orientation and induction ceremony in July 2025, prior to the start of fall semester classes.**

Information on these events will be sent to your GTCC email in June 2025. You will also be contacted by your assigned GTCC Faculty Advisor for RIBN (FA), who will help you register for your fall semester classes. The FA will work with you each semester to make sure you are keeping on track toward completion of the program.

## ACADEMIC YEAR ONE: 2025-2026

In your first year of the RIBN program, you will be working on **completing the general education courses** required for both your Associate Degree *and* Bachelor of Science in Nursing programs.

You will also begin taking some preliminary nursing student success and mentoring courses with NC A&T, which are taught online. You will also take one of your first Bachelor of Science in Nursing program courses, Biostatistics (NURS 204), which is taught ONLINE).

**Note: If you have completed several required general education courses, you may not be considered a full-time student for the first year of the program. Please consider how your student status may affect your financial aid eligibility.**

**By the June 1, 2026, you must have obtained current certification as a NC Nurse Aide I. This is required for all students entering GTCC's Associate Degree Nursing program.**
