Guidelines:

1. We are looking for applications for work that is deemed outstanding by the faculty in an academic or technical field.
2. This is not a venue for student work to be graded. The application should represent exemplary work resulting from a prior evaluation process.
3. In keeping with the purpose of Student Presentation Day, clubs and/or club members are invited to submit an application as long as the presentation is showcasing an academic or technical accomplishment in a curriculum area and a faculty sponsor supports this accomplishment.
4. Sponsoring faculty should be involved with the project described in the application.

Types of Participation:

- **Presentation:** oral delivery of materials related to the project that could include visual aids/multimedia. **(NOTE: Presentations are generally in 15-minute blocks)**
- **Exhibit:** display project and be prepared to explain the content and answer audience questions.
- **Demonstration:** show the process required to create the project.
- **Videos:** Recorded processes involving students producing/demonstrating outstanding work usually in the technical fields (30-minute time-slot—maybe 15 minutes video then 15 minutes Q&A or explanation, etc.)
